Ali

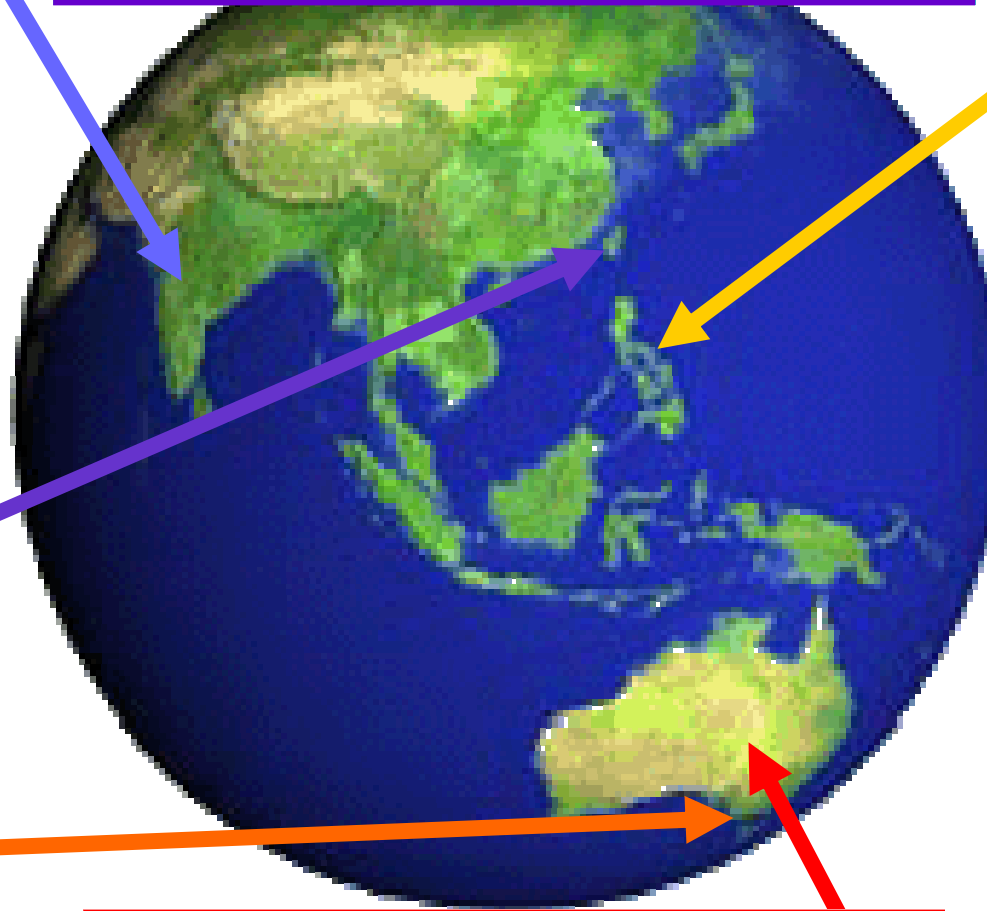
